

Brigandi Reelected

The Hicksville Water District has announced that Nicholas J. Brigandi has been reelected to the post of Commissioner.

Mr. Brigandi will serve a three-year term. A total of 141 votes were cast for his reelection; no opposing votes were cast.

School Board Delays Tax Rate Vote Again

On August 30, the Hicksville School Board again voted 4-3 to table a recommendation from Superintendent Catherine Fenton to approve the amount of the 1989-90 budget needed to operate the schools and the library. It was anticipated that the 140,686,710 budget approved by tax payers on June 21 would raise taxes by \$1.54 per \$100 assessed valuation; however, as reported earlier this month, a 2.0 percent increase in Hicksville's assessed valuation has reduced the increase to \$1.73, a savings of \$.81/\$100. The school board must approve a Nassau County Board of Supervisors Resolution attesting to the amount needed to operate the schools and library. Board President Mark Cardella, Vice President Daniel MacBride, Secretary James Martillo and Trustee William Collins have twice voted to table action in this matter causing the School District to file for an extension until Sept. 13.

At the board's meeting on Aug. 30, residents spoke regarding their concerns with the board's delay in attesting to a budget which was approved by the taxpayers. Although these residents brought up the current negotiations with the teachers' union and various articles that have appeared in the press which indicate that the board is contemplating a double-digit percent increase for the union, Mr. Cardella offered no information other than the teachers' contract would be voted on at a public meeting.

Mr. MacBride made the motion which tabled the superintendent's recommendation. He called for a meeting of the school board on Sept. 6 on this issue. According to parliamentary procedure, after Mr. Collins seconded the motion, no debate was possible. The board then voted 4-3 to table.

Board trustee William Bennett asked for an explanation as to why the majority of the board "had refused again to give the taxpayers the 81 cents."

Mr. MacBride spoke regarding approximately \$5,000,000 needed for asbestos abatement which he said would have to be raised by a tax levy or borrowing. Board trustee JoAnn Miltenberg said she believed the district could budget \$900,000 yearly and remove the asbestos over a longer period of time than called for by the Asbestos Management Plan. Although another management plan would have to be filed with the state, Mrs. Miltenberg said the cost of such a plan would be far less than interest on a bond issue. The cost of the first asbestos management plan was \$76,000. Mrs. Miltenberg added proceeding slowly with asbestos abatement will give technology the chance to catch up with the problem.

Residents continued to address the board throughout the evening regarding the issue of the budget. Carolyn Kelly commented that since residents approve a budget amount the board should be bound "by the amount of money that we said you could spend." Helen Lafferty outlined information regarding teacher negotiations which she had read and which indicate that a double digit increase is being considered. Mr. MacBride questioned the accuracy of the information which appeared in the press. Referring to the current situation at Grumman, which employs many Hicksville residents, Helen Lafferty stated it shows "great insensitivity on the part of the teachers' union and certain board members as to what this community can afford." Mrs. Lafferty added that she has "always felt that the teachers in Hicksville should be paid the very best salary that this community can afford." Former board member Arlene Rudin commented that in the past the school board has taken action to cause the tax rate to be set higher than it could have been.

Resident Lynn Flynn confronted the board and asked each member why they voted as they did. Mr. Bennett and Patricia Rooney stated that they voted "no" because they

Budget Cuts Make Room for Child Safety Plans

The Hicksville School Board took action last week to create hall monitor positions in the elementary schools, to construct reception booths in elementary schools, and to provide for bus monitors on kindergarten runs. In addition, the board approved an arrangement with North Shore University Hospital to provide services that may be necessary in the area of child molestation, including in-service training, parental guidance and student counseling.

The approximate cost for the above items should not exceed \$250,000. Sixteen part-time positions as hall monitors would cost approximately \$112,200. Public concern was raised over the \$8,700 anticipated cost of the reception booths. Thomas Shaw, director of Operations and Facilities, explained that fire regulations made it necessary to have permanent stations built in the schools' hallways. He also anticipates overtime costs will be necessary in order to have the district's employees construct these booths as soon as possible. Additional construction will occur at East Avenue because of the physical layout of the building.

Additional concerns were raised over the estimated cost of \$80,000 for monitors on the kindergarten buses. Those bus runs where students in grades 1-6 are transported along with kindergarten students would not have a monitor. William Hall, Assistant Superintendent for Business Services, indicated that the \$80,000 was a preliminary figure based on full-day coverage by monitors and that the actual costs should be less. The board's recommendation called for an adjustment on the transportation bids subject to the approval of the bus company, the Civil Service Commission and the State Education Department.

Based on the experience of the Family Crisis Center at North Shore University Hospital, superintendent Dr. Catherine Fenton and the director of Special Education/Pupil Personnel Services, Dr. Daniel Kremin, recommended that the district enter into a contract with the hospital to provide supportive services to staff, parents and children on child molestation. The anticipated cost is between \$40,000 and \$45,000 or as Dr. Fenton stated, the cost of a full-time staff member.

In order to fund the unexpected \$250,000 in costs, the board voted to make cuts in the existing 1989-90 budget as follows:

- Two librarian positions will not be filled (part-time librarians will remain at Woodland, Willet, Dutch and Fork).
- Only one guidance position will be filled at the high school instead of two.
- Approximately five to seven hall monitors may be transferred from the high school to elementary schools at a savings of \$25,000.
- A reduction of \$40,000 was made in staff conference and travel.
- Monies will be transferred from the curriculum writing code and \$10,000 in funds allocated for consultants will be used for these safety precautions and services.

Dr. Fenton indicated that the cuts and various transfers of funds would approximate \$221,000 and that the rest of the money needed would be found in other ways.

Safety Precautions In Building

Dr. Fenton reviewed safety precautions which the district had undertaken in the past

few years, which included security cameras and the designation of only one open door in an elementary school. She detailed new measures that will now be taken, which include: the wearing of badges by administrators and maintenance workers when they go to the various schools. Visiting administrators and teachers will sign in with the building monitors. Parents will also be required to sign in when visiting the schools. Dr. Fenton said "from experience we have learned that we're not concerned primarily with the stranger. We're concerned with the person that everybody knows."

Only one door in all districts schools will be open for visitors. Although Dr. Fenton said this will be difficult in the middle school and the high school where students often leave doors open, visitors will be obligated to use the designated front door only. If a school monitor is delayed or absent, the school security cameras will be used as a backup.

Safety Precautions On Buses

Dr. Fenton said that the district would keep duplicate records of all bus company employees. In addition, any bus company that the district contracts with will be informed that drivers will be required to observe the following rules and regulations or place their job in jeopardy:

- No physical contact between the driver

and children unless directly related to the job.

- No exchange of gifts, candy, etc.
- No exchange of phone numbers, addresses, pictures, etc.
- Bus drivers must remain with the bus during field trips and not accompany the class.
- No weapons on buses. Dr. Fenton added that retired policemen who have the right to carry a gun and who serve as busdrivers will not be allowed to carry the weapon on their person or in the bus.

According to Dr. Fenton, the district wants "parents to become far more aware of their children's bus route" and how to make complaints. Bus routes, which may be updated after the first few weeks of school, will be available from building principals. Parents will be asked to notify the schools if buses are late or early. Children will no longer be allowed to get off a bus at any stop other than their assigned stop.

The bus company will be requested to affix a decal to its buses identifying them as a Hicksville bus. The route number must be posted as well as a complaint telephone number.

Mr. Hall has requested that a complaint phone be placed in the Transportation Office. Complaint forms are to be instituted. Anonymous complaints, as well as com-

plaints from known individuals, will be registered and followed up. Dr. Fenton said the new procedures would take a lot of writing and time but was "well worth it to regain everybody's confidence in the system."

The District's attorney has prepared a sample policy on disclosure of information. This is only a preliminary policy, which will be discussed further before a final policy is approved by the board at a public meeting.

Sample Policy on Disclosure of Information:

Should the district be made aware that an individual performing services for the district has been arrested for an offense involving moral turpitude and/or improper conduct with a juvenile, the district will attempt to notify the parents of those students whom the district has reason to believe may have been in contact with said individual.

Harran Bus Company

Several residents questioned the continuance of the district's contract with Harran Bus Company. Richard Pender stated that he felt that Harran had failed in their responsibility when after receiving a complaint letter about Robert Izzo they did not investigate and transferred him to another route. The district's attorney, Gregory Guercio, advised that the burden of establishing the truthfulness of any allegation lies with the Hicksville School District, which would require "police-like investigation."

In answer to Mr. Pender's question, Mr. Hall stated that the Harran Contract was renewed on June 21, 1989 and is in the third year of

a six-year contract. Mr. Guercio explained that in instances where a district has changed bus companies the new company has commonly utilized the buses and drivers from the previous bus company.

Mr. Pender concluded by saying that Harran "in some way, shape or form is going to have to be responsible and I think that contract should not be renewed in three years even if they are the lowest bidder because they fall down on the job very badly."

In reply to Arlene Rudin's question, Mr. Hall stated that Harran does not drive for any other district at this time. Mrs. Rudin suggested that Hicksville ask other districts why they no longer used Harran.

Board Committees

Leadership roles on the various board committees were established: Curriculum, Patricia Rooney and JoAnn Miltenberg; Policy and Legislation, JoAnn Miltenberg; Finance, William Bennett; Facilities, William Collins.

Mr. Martillo will serve as alternate on Curriculum and Policy and Legislation. Mr. MacBride will be the alternate on Finance and Facilities. Mr. Cardella will chair the Personnel Committee, which is not a public meeting as it meets to discuss confidential matters. Mr. Collins and Mr. Martillo will rotate as alternates on the Personnel Committee. Dates for committee meetings appear on the school calendar.

The board will continue to meet at 8:15 p.m. during the 1989-90 school year.

Classes Split

Dr. Fenton recommended that three classes be split because of size. The board concurred and additional teachers will be employed for the fourth grade at Dutch Lane and the first grades at Fork Lane and Woodland Avenue.

Special Education

Rosemary Planz, a Resource Room teacher at Fork Lane and a district employee for more than 10 years, has been named Assistant Director of Special Education and Pupil Personnel Services.

Public Concerns

Many residents spoke regarding their concerns for the safety of the district's children. Joe Visconti stated that the district's main priority should be the safety and security of our children.

Rising taxes and the effect on residents was brought up. One resident expressed his concern that Hicksville coaches receive a fair and equitable contract.

Carolyn Kelly asked the board to consider closing two schools which she said would save the district \$1,500,000 annually.

Many residents spoke throughout the meeting regarding the conduct of various Board members. Former board trustee Larry Wolfson suggested that the board avail themselves of the services provided by the New York State School Boards Association to discuss the problems of a divided school board. He said, "Your basic obligation is to the people of Hicksville and to the students of Hicksville...on behalf of the people of Hicksville I implore you to get back to boardmanship and education."

The next meeting of the Hicksville School Board will be on September 6, at 8:15 p.m. in the high school cafeteria.

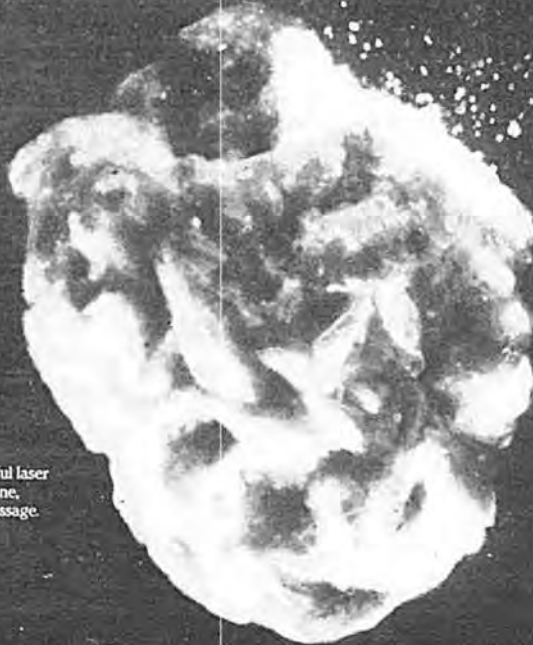

wanted to give the money back to the taxpayers. Mr. Martillo said that "internal conflicts" have prevented the board from properly discussing this issue. Mr. Cardella, when asked what he was going to do, stated "I don't know."

Mr. MacBride said that before the evening's meeting he was inclined to "take the eighty one cents from (the taxpayers)...I have not done that because of information and legitimate debate from other board members and hearing the members of the community...I have a problem..."

Mrs. Miltenberg said that the tax rate should be set "at what the people deserve."

Several residents, including Mrs. Flynn, reminded Mr. Collins that he had campaigned on behalf of the senior citizens and tax-

payers as he "waved his pension check." Mr. Collins refused to answer why he voted to table the motion stating, "I have no answer for you because the board is polled by the president...you have no authority to conduct a vote..." Mrs. Flynn said Mr. Collins was "taking the easy way out."

Holy Trinity Welcomes Latest Masterpiece

Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Church will officially dedicate a new ceiling painting by George Filippakis, a member of the church who is responsible for many other paintings in the church.

His latest masterpiece will be presented to the public during the Greek Festival, Sept. 8 through 10. All of Mr. Filippakis's paintings are Greek Orthodox Byzantine In-

conography. The Icon (holy picture) of Pantocrator (he who holds the universe [Christ the Almighty]) and Christ as Archpriest (bishop performing the Divine Liturgy (service) assisted by angels and deacons is a duplicate of the 15th century painting in the monastery of Stravronketas in Mt. Athos, Greece. The original was painted by Theophanes the Cretan.

I spoke to several mothers who were upset that they had to practically walk over him to take their children into the park. In fact, many of them left because their children were frightened. Is our lovely park going to be taken over by the vagrants who are now wandering through the neighborhood?

On the same day, after lunch, a man left the church and stopped a motorist on New South Road. He hung on the car and cursed at the driver. Meanwhile four people cursed at each other in the church parking lot.

On August 30, a vagrant kept walking back and forth on my block waiting for the Soup Kitchen to open. He asked a walking Wall Street commuter for money. When he was refused, he cursed at him.

On August 31, I went to the LIRR to purchase two monthly tickets at a cost of \$240.

I encountered several bums drinking, smoking pot and being abusive to those around them. These are the same men that walk through a residential area to the Soup Kitchen. Where do they get the money for liquor and drugs? When they arrive at the Soup Kitchen they are joined by approximately 20 people who travel by car everyday. One of the cars is from out of state.

I have seen some of the vagrants urinate by the trees next to the church.

I am a 30-year resident of Hicksville and take great pride in my home and my town. My husband works and my sons go to school and work. I am presently employed part time in two jobs and volunteer numerous hours for the betterment of the entire Hicksville community.

Your editorial last week stated that many merchants around Holy Trinity Episcopal Church blamed INN for derelicts loitering and despoiling their businesses. INN has moved the problem from its previous location to a beautiful residential area.

The Investor's Corner

The Oil Industry

The oil industry as we know it is much more than oil. It is natural gas, plastics, and chemicals to name a few businesses. It is a

business that explores, refines, distributes and retails its products. It is a domestic business and an international business. Most of the major players are fully integrated multinationals. They are big businesses. It is also a very lucky business. In the beginning, when the industry was very young there were no anti-trust laws to impede growth. The great Rockefeller who was to become the great oil baron did not even think that the

oil business had any real future when he investigated it the first time. A second look convinced him otherwise, and the rest is history. The oil business grew in spite of itself. It was always efficient in production. Cost reduction was the god. It was never an industry that was innovative. In fact, the oil business (as opposed to the other businesses that they are in), has not been responsible for ANY innovation that has led to its growth. It did not invent the automobile that took it from a kerosene producer to a gasoline producer. Not one oil company invested in Henry Ford's young company. Nor did it invent the use of lead in the gasoline, that gave us the power that we crave. It has nothing to do with the development of the oil burner that saves us from the backbreaking labor of taking out the ashes from the coal burners we had. How many can remember the filth from the coal in the basements that we all panelled during the 60's? They were not even good marketers of their products. Marketing was seen as a method to get rid of the product at any price. The profits were made in the production and refining operations.

During the threat of a forced US government split-up of the large companies in the 60's, the major oil companies drastically restructured their companies in anticipation of the split. Again, it was one of the best things to happen to them even though they were not split. For the first time, the divisions, i.e., exploration, production, distribution and marketing had to stand alone and produce profits. It greatly increased everyone's efficiency and profits. Despite their great size they remain lean and fit today, true heavyweights.

Since the restructuring, they have been hit from all sides by major crises. Expropriation of their oil fields in the Middle East, oil embargos, and the mandated conversion to unleaded gasoline (they did nothing about the pollution their products caused) to name a few that have buffeted the industry. They have survived quite well.

The other businesses that they have gotten into, chemicals and plastics in particular, were developed by Dupont in the early 30's. Here again, they are efficient producers in a classic textbook mode. In good times and bad, they have become profit producers with excellent cashflow. In addition, they, as an industry, do not carry high debt. Texaco, the one with the highest debt, has an acceptable debt load. I see this industry poised for some huge takeover attempts. All of the ingredients are there. The money is there because banks all over the world are loaded with liquidity, the cashflow to pay the bond debt is high and the efficient will not be lost. Expect consolidations on an international scale.

What advice can I offer? First, be careful of your bonds in this industry, many will go from AAA to "junk" in the takeovers, as Texaco's did. The common stockholders will benefit greatly. Since the dividends are very good for most oil companies, I would switch from bonds to common stock in this industry and wait. Even if I am wrong, it is hard to get hurt in this business if you are a long term investor. Just pick your stock well. Doctor Frey is a professor of investments and finance at LIU/CW Post campus

The headlines talk about jobs being eliminated on Long Island. Electric rates are careening to the highest levels in the nation. Affordable housing for our young and seniors is almost nonexistent. Sales tax revenues are down. Real estate taxes seem to be on a free flight upwards. Enter talk about an income tax for Nassau and Suffolk residents! Is Long Island ready for an income tax? Can we really afford an income tax or even talk of such a tax?



For those who say it will help real estate values, I say nonsense! An income tax would be enough of an added burden to potentially kill business growth on the Island. With Connecticut and New Jersey beckoning to New York City residents, their sights would soon zero in on attracting Long Islanders. Every week, I hear from someone who is moving or has moved a portion of a business off of Long Island. How many businesses have also looked at the Island as a place to be and been turned off by what they find? For some it has been the attitude of the Suffolk County Legislature. The Legislature's passage, over Pat Halpin's veto, of a politically motivated law to place an unfair burden on businesses using visual display terminals was the height of anti-business legislation. Other business people see no prudent controls over school budgets. Accountability, at the local government level, tends to depend on which civic group makes the most noise. We find few government officials willing to stand up for what is right when an issue is unpopular. And finally, to develop something on Long Island takes forever. It is easier to build elsewhere.

We must nourish growth on the Island. Otherwise, there will be no economy left here to worry about how to tax. Unfortunately, an unhappy business person, on Long Island or elsewhere, votes with a moving van. They pack up and move on—leaving vacant buildings. And, they take good people along with them in many instances.

One good friend of mine recently described moving some of his operations to Pennsylvania. "As the word got out that employees could buy the same house there for half the price on Long Island," he said, "an avalanche of people asked to join the move." With all of our parks, beaches and golf courses, the cost of housing alone causes many to consider moving. It does not have to be that way.

We have been spoiled for a long time on Long Island. Governments, including school boards, could tax and spend and spend and tax with impunity. That binge is now definitely over, and any government official who does not understand may be subject to the ballot box guillotine. But an income tax is not the answer. We need more accountability in government and our school systems. Rather than talk about new taxes, I would like to see a great deal more emphasis on a spending freeze. Then, let's take a look at how we might consolidate school district expenses without giving up the current autonomy of operation. A central purchasing authority for both counties and school boards might make sense. If private sector long Island hospitals can pool their purchasing power, then how about local governments and schools?

It will take more than newly created self-motivated political parties set up just at election time to deal with the Long Island real estate tax crisis. It is the responsibility of each of us to practice restraint and urge our elected officials to do likewise. The first time you hear someone seriously mention an income tax for Long Island, ask that person what percentage of tax would be imposed and also ask for the details about what he or she has done to reduce government spending. The Pressure Principle

East dealer.
East-West vulnerable.
NORTH
♠ Q 10 5 3
♥ A 9 7 2
♦ K 7 4
♣ Q 6

WEST
♠ A K J 6
♥ 5
♦ Q 9 6 3

The bidding:
East South West North
Pass 1 ♥ Dble 4 ♣
Opening lead — king of spades.

you realize that West is far more likely to have the queen of diamonds than East, bearing in mind his double of your opening one heart bid.

So, instead of putting all your chips on the outcome of a diamond finesse, you decide to apply some pressure against West to see whether he can withstand it.

You ruff a club with the nine, ruff the ten of spades, and play three rounds of trumps, producing this position:

North
♠ Q
♦ K 7 4

West
♠ A
♥ Q 9 6

South
♥ 8
♦ A J 2

East
♠ 8
♥ 10 8 5

Let's assume you get to four hearts on the bidding shown. West leads the king of spades and shifts to the ace of clubs, East signaling with the nine. West continues with a club, taken by East with the king, and East returns a spade which you ruff.

Superficially, it seems that your best chance at this point is to rely on a diamond finesse, hoping to find East with the queen. But when you think about the matter some more,

You lead your last trump, forcing West to discard a diamond as dummy also discards a diamond and East discards a spade. You then play the deuce of diamonds to the king and a diamond back toward your A.J. Now, backing your judgment that West probably has the queen of diamonds, you go up with the ace, catch the queen, and in that way bring home the contract.
