Dish for This Week
 Open season on home-grown tomatoes is here! and along with time-tested tomato salads and tomato steaks comes this recipe for tomato cutlets that are tender, brown and crispy on the outside and red and juicy in the middle.

Tomato Cutlets
 Remove the skins from firm, large tomatoes; chill and cut the tomatoes in one-inch slices. Sprinkle them with salt, pepper, and sugar. To a beaten egg add 3 tablespoons of milk. Roll the slices of tomato in bread crumbs, then in the egg and milk mixture, and again in the crumbs. Saute in bacon fat until they are brown.

Put a mound of flaky boiled rice in the center of a platter. Pour around it a plain cheese sauce, make a border of the tomato cutlets and bacon curls, and garnish the dish with parsley.

To make large fluffy rice with each grain separate, wash it in hot water before cooking to remove any extra starch powder; then sprinkle it into rapidly boiling water (2 quarts for every cup of dry rice) containing 2 teaspoons of salt, and let it boil gently, stirring occasionally with a fork, until a few grains pinched together seem soft throughout. This takes about 20 minutes.

When cooked, put the rice in a colander and pour hot water through it to separate the grains and to wash away loose starch. Then, to make it even lighter and fluffier, let the rice steam over boiling water for 10 or 15 minutes. Prepared this way, one cup of dry rice should make 2, or 4 cups of cooked rice.

For dinner, the New York State College of Home Economics suggests: A platter of rice, bacon curls and tomato cutlets, a salad of greens or lettuce with French dressing and crackers; a deep-dish cherry pie coffee for grown-ups; and milk, at least for the youngsters.

THE INITIAL SOFTBALL race in Hicksville is all over now with the Firemen winning the crown. The Vamps clinched the title on Tuesday night as they routed the Cubs by a 9-1 score.

The Vamps were easily the class of the circuit and once they had supplanted the Scouts in first place on June 27, they never were headed although the knights made it quite interesting when they upset the leaders by 2-1 a month back. The Boscos knocked the K of C out of their chance last week by taking a 5-4 thriller.

The airtight defense of the Vamps was the answer of the Smoke Eaters triumph. Few teams ever touched Fred Miller's fireball and when they did, the inner circle, led by the brilliant Lou Kappastaler, cut them down in easy fashion. Only on few occasions did the Vamps opponents score more than five runs. The first one it occurred, the Scouts eked out an 8-6 victory and a few weeks back the Veterans managed to score eight runs too but the Vamps scored 21.

The lone interesting feature in the race which terminates next week is the battle for second place which the Knights and Boscos are staging. The Redmen are rooting the Vamps to turn back the Knights next week and if they do, the Boscos will undoubtedly finish deadlocked for third place.

Personally, Hicksville did have quite a lot of 'dead-end' on the squad in the past two years and these new boys should round off the edges in the right manner.

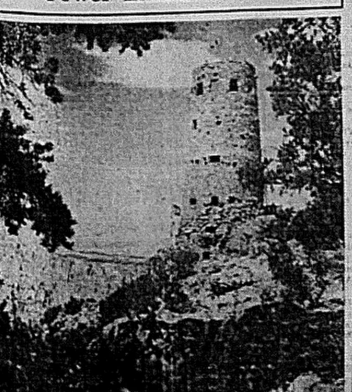
The pony backfield will again be back in harness and the offense being built around this fast-moving quartet, the opposition will have plenty to do in stopping Hicksville onslaught.

HERE AND NOW

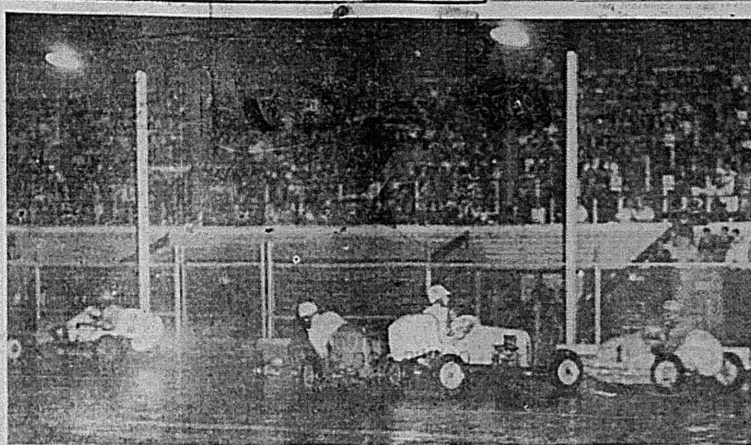

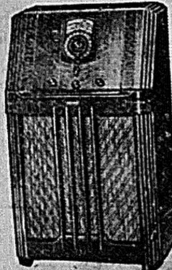
